COVID-19 UPDATE

Hello, Oak Hammock community.

The number of positive COVID-19 cases on our campus continues to remain low. On Monday, an Assisted Living resident tested positive and as a result, all AL residents were tested, revealing a second positive resident in AL. We are thankful we have an efficient process in place to discover any positive results among residents or staff.

Confirmed COVID-19 Case Count

- As of this afternoon, we have a total confirmed number of **5 positive cases**, with additional tests under review.
- Of the confirmed positive individuals, 3 are staff members, and 2 are AL residents. All are isolating.
- Of the confirmed cases among staff, 1 of those employees works in Skilled Nursing, 1 works in AL, and 1 is a contracted employee.
- None of these individuals have required hospitalization.

Dining Services Update

- Tomorrow, Wednesday, February 9, we will reopen **one** of the main dining rooms during regular hours for sit-down service at a reduced capacity with social distancing measures in place.
 - Breakfast begins at 7 a.m.
 - Lunch service is 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m., every day.
 - Dinner service is from 5 - 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday, from 5 - 8 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and from 5 - 7 p.m. on Sunday.
- We are unable to open both main dining rooms and the Grill Room at this time due to staffing constraints.
- Delivery and take-out options are still available. Remember, **for breakfast**, delivery is not available, but pick-up is available after 7 a.m.
- Catering and events in the private dining rooms are not available at this time.

Remain Vigilant

Alachua County continues to rate high for COVID-19 positive cases at 25.7%. While Oak Hammock's numbers are low, we should remain vigilant about the basic and most important means recommended to stay safe.

- We are asking that you keep any guests out of common areas, such as the lobbies and the fitness center.
- Remember to wear a tight-fitting mask when outside of your home.
- Wash hands frequently throughout the day.
